



A tin roof is now sitting on the south roof of St Dunstan's in Mayfield. It was not planned to be there but work expected to finish by Christmas, revealed serious structural problems with the old beams, caused by death watch beetle. Structural engineers have drawn up a remedial plan, and the tin roof has arrived to allow the skilled workmen to do their job in

the dry. Hopefully all will be done by Easter or the end of April 2019. Meanwhile steps have been taken to ensure that the Church is totally safe to enter.

Many of you will know the interior of our Grade I Listed Church by coming to some wonderful concerts and, most recently, our Village community play as well as some great children, family and school events. It is a treasure for wonderful occasions like these and we should be rightly proud of our building's beauty and its broad versatility. Our recent 'strap-line' on our Church noticeboard says "St Dunstan's is a place of welcome, wonder and worship" and we hope you agree.

The additional work comes at a cost; the original contract of £120,000 will now be £220,000. There is no choice but to do the work and in order to help finance these repairs, the Church has launched an appeal to the Community to help meet these costs to ensure our much loved church is fully restored. Notes to Gift Aid Declaration

1. If your declaration covers donations you make in future:-
 - a. Please notify us if you change your name and address while the declaration is still in force
 - b. You may cancel the declaration at any time in writing. It will not then apply to donations you make on or after the date of cancellation or such later date as you specify.
2. You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to that we reclaim on your donation in the tax year (currently 25p of each £1.00 you donate)
