

COLLECT

Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity. Amen

POST COMMUNION

God of Life, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection have delivered us from the power of our enemy: grant us so to die daily to sin, that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his risen life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

PAUSE FOR THOUGHT

Easter Sunday—The Resurrection Morning—a morning of surprises

But hadn't Jesus been doing and saying surprising things throughout his life and ministry? From his birth onwards the record of the Gospels is one of surprising events and actions. C.S. Lewis wrote "Surprised by Joy" and Gerard Hughes wrote "God of Surprises". The latter has a pertinent point for us after our sad and turbulent year. He points out how the people to whom Christ appears after his resurrection are all

in a negative mood...terrified, sad, distraught and disillusioned.

You might expect Easter, like Christmas, to be a difficult time for people who have suffered pain or loss. But Easter is somehow different; its story of passion, death and resurrection actually means more to people who have suffered. Hughes suggests that the answer is in the pain which reveals to us our spiritual poverty and need of God. If we can be still in our poverty, Christ will show himself to us in his glory.

May the God of Surprises fill us all with true Joy.

COLLECT

Almighty Father, you have given your only Son to die for our sins and to rise again for our justification: grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness that we may always serve you in pureness of living and truth; through the merits of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

POST COMMUNION

Lord God our Father, through our Saviour Jesus Christ you have assured your children of eternal life and in baptism have made us one with him: deliver us from the death of sin and raise us to new life in your love, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

PAUSE FOR THOUGHT—EASTER 2

Eastertide is the period of fifty days from Easter Day until Pentecost Sunday. The Sunday after Easter Day, is commonly called "Low Sunday" in contrast to the "High" feast of the former. In church circles it's often sadly named because of the expected low attendance numbers. In our reading from Acts 4 we are shown how Our Lord's

resurrection affected that first Christian community. We find them united in a common purpose, without in-house arguments, and free of possessiveness. They are still excited and amazed by the Resurrection and are conscious of the risen Jesus living among them in person.

The Risen Jesus walks into any gathering, in any age, even those who have locked themselves in. **John 20 v19 Di**
