The Gospel of John places Mary at the foot of the cross beside 'the beloved disciple' and according to Luke, she was among the disciples gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem after Jesus' Ascension. She was in effect the first and perfect pattern of discipleship; she is thus honoured among the saints. In the darkness of faith she offered her consent to the mysterious plan of God; and in the light of grace she responded with her extraordinary song of praise and thanksgiving.


