# **OUR NEW VICAR: FR. MICHAEL ASQUITH**

The Churchwardens were delighted to be able to announce on August 15<sup>th</sup> that Fr Michael Asquith has accepted Bishop Martin's offer to be our next Vicar.

Fr. Michael is currently Rector at St Margaret's in Lowestoft, Area Dean and Chaplain to the local Air Training Corps squadron. Having been at St Margaret's since 2011 he has initiated many projects including the creation of an Open the Book team (taking Bible stories into two local primary academies) and, during the pandemic, started on-line services which are now streamed on their you tube channel.

Schools, especially church schools have featured prominently in Fr Michael's ministry. Immediately prior to 2011 Fr. Michael was the Assistant Diocesan Director of Education in the diocese of Leicester looking after 98 church schools and academies. As Rector in Corby, he regularly visited 4 schools and, as Mayor's Chaplain, worked closely with the council representing the churches in the early stages of Corby's regeneration. He completed his curacy, in Ashford, Kent. Prior to ordination Fr. Michael managed the timetable and taught Religious Education and Science in a secondary school for 11 years.

Fr Michael is married to Jo and they have two daughters: Vikki who currently lives in Cumbria and works as an analytical chemist and Tina who lives with their two grandsons. Fr Michael and Jo will be accompanied by their (rescue) dog – Kodiak – a Siberian Husky.

Beyond the church Fr. Michael and Jo enjoy making the most of their National Trust membership and exploring places. They enjoy their holidays abroad, never ones to sit by the pool and do nothing, but exploring and discovering the local area, though equally they enjoy the many weeks they have spent on a canal boat in the Midlands, meandering along at 3 mph (and negotiating locks, lots of locks). He's often seen with a camera too – enjoying taking photographs. Michael also counts wine making and model railways amongst his interests.

#### Fr. Michael has written:

"I am really excited about coming to live and minister in Mayfield and Five Ashes.

I really enjoy the traditions of the Church of England which are so much part of St Dunstan's. I am looking forward to the opportunity to increase the variety of worship at St Dunstan's whilst maintaining the core worship you currently enjoy. I am excited for the chance to work with all the local schools, with the Weald Foundation, and particularly



with your two church schools: Five Ashes and Mayfield Primary Schools. And I am looking forward to meeting you, as together we live in Mayfield and Five Ashes.

As the next few weeks progress we will all get to know more of the arrangements for me beginning the next phase of my ministry amongst you which will probably be in November – but do watch the <u>St Dunstan's website</u> for more information (<a href="http://www.stdunstansmayfield.org.uk">http://www.stdunstansmayfield.org.uk</a>)."

We look forward to extending a warm welcome to Fr. Michael and to Jo. The date of the installation has yet to be confirmed.


