To join both services you need either to have signed up to zoom on your browser and followed the instructions, or to have downloaded the 'zoom cloud meetings' app on your phone or ipad. Having got your zoom facility, simply click on the link below:

These details remain the same every week.

Please, as soon as you join the service put yourself on mute and stay on mute until you are asked to unmute. Join the service early (from 0945) if in doubt where your mute button is and we can help you! If you join by phone *6 will mute you and to unmute tap *6 again. This helps avoid distractions to others.
