To join it you need either to have signed up to zoom on your browser and followed the instructions or to have downloaded the 'zoom cloud meetings' app on your phone or ipad. Having got your zoom facility, simply click on the link below:

These details remain the same every week.

If you DON'T have internet or don't wish to use it, simply call on your telephone 0203 4815240. You will be asked for the meeting code which is **82110568906** followed by #; your participant code which is simply #; and the passcode 506133

followed by # If you have any trouble doing this, or downloading the app, please call: 01435 872665 (Philip James) or 07710 319348 (Mike Hand-Bowman) who are only too happy to help.

Please, as soon as you join the service put yourself on mute and stay on mute until you are asked to unmute. Join the service early (from 0945) if in doubt where your mute button is and we can help you! If you join by phone *6 will mute you and to unmute tap *6 again. This helps avoid distractions to others.


