

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart. In Jesus Christ our Lord in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

James the Apostle, known as James the Great. Jesus named James and his brother John 'Sons of Thunder'. They were rather head strong and hot-headed. (He is not to be confused with James the brother of Jesus.) A Holy Day for a holy man. That, of course, is where we get our word holiday—from the Old English halig (holy) & daeg (day).

READINGS: Ephesians 4: 1-16 John 6: 24-35

COLLECT Almighty God, who sent your Holy Spirit



to be the life and light of your Church: open our hearts to the riches of your grace, that we may bring forth the fruit of the Spirit in love and joy and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

POST COMMUNION
Holy Father, who gathered us here around the table of your Son to share this meal with the whole household of God: in that new world where you reveal the fullness of your peace, gather people of every race and language to share in the eternal banquet of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Our Gospel reading comes straight after the famous 'Feeding of the five thousand.' The people were clinging to every move Jesus made but for the wrong reasons; in this case for more bread and fish. But Our Lord isn't there for self indulgence, he is the **Bread of Life**. He supplies us with the 'food' we need in order to live out his risen life among the people we are led to serve.

Continuing the **Bread of Life** theme; do we take up Jesus' offer of feeding and relying on it for 'dear life' or do we tend to glance at it but commit ourselves to 'spiritual junk food', or 'spiritual starvation'? Those Jews in our Gospel reading hadn't listened or learned. If they had, they would have been like the godly Simeon and recognised Him as the visible expression of God's life and nourishment. (Luke 2:25-32)

POST 19 JULY ARRANGEMENTS

In line with updated guidelines from both HM Government and the Church of England, the PCC has agreed new arrangements for services which will take immediate effect. Our objective is to provide a safe and secure environment for all whilst recognising we all have different appetites for risk.

- Face masks will not be required although we recognise many will still prefer to wear them at their personal discretion.
- It will no longer be necessary to register your attendance for track and trace purposes.
- Seating will continue to be spaced in line with our practice over the last twelve months.
- Both choir and congregational singing will be permitted in church with unrestricted numbers.
- Hymn books and service booklets will be in use.
- Cómmunion will remain as bread only, as agreed with our visiting clergy.
- Sharing of Peace will remain as a nod and a wave.
- Refreshments coffee will be served from the back of church/ outside the West door in the usual manner.
- Bell ringers will no longer be subject to social distancing protocols.
- It is hoped Sunday School and Messy church will be able to resume from the start of the Autumn term in September
- The Church will be open daily from Monday, 3 August 2021

Our church is large well-ventilated space with ample room for people to spread as they chose and according to their personal appetite to risk. Hand sanitiser will continue to be provided and the doors will be left open during services to allow good ventilation.
