PAUSE FOR THOUGHT

In our Gospel reading we have Jesus putting himself to a very severe test. He comes to his hometown as a Rabbi, preaching to those who knew him when he was growing up. They knew his background. He is greeted with hostility and resentment. What right had he to teach them! It's far easier to cope with holiness in strangers

(maybe it doesn't feel quite so much like personal criticism). To quote William Barclay "There can be no preaching in the wrong atmosphere neither can there be peace making if folk come together to see no other point of view but their own, they will see no other." He ends: "We can open the door wide to Jesus Christ, or we can slam it in his face."
