COLLECT

Almighty God, who raised up Dunstan to be a true shepherd of the flock, a restorer of monastic life and a faithful counsellor to those in authority; give to all pastors the same gifts of your Holy Spirit that they may be true servants of Christ and of all his people; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever

POST COMMUNION

God, Shepherd of your people, whose servant Dunstan revealed the loving service of Christ in his ministry as a pastor of your people; by this Eucharist in which we share, awaken within us the love of Christ and keep us faithful to our Christian calling; through him who laid down his life for us, but is alive and reigns with you, now and for ever.

PAUSE FOR THOUGHT

Coming out of Lockdown restrictions and hopefully getting nearer to normal life is a bit of a worrying business. Have we got it right? Why do we feel so uncomfortable? Why do we keep forgetting words and names? (Join the club!) If anyone had cause to worry it was St. Paul, writing from Rome, chained to a guard, awaiting his sentence; he might be acquitted or he might be beheaded! Plus he was

burdened with the problems of the church he founded..... persecutions, disunity and false teachers. But he sends them and us that lovely list (Philippians 4:8,9) from today's New Testament reading, to set everyone on the right path. His epistle is a sort of 'psychology book' based on Christian doctrine, not a 'self help' but a 'God help.'

I guess our St Dunstan, with his multitude of tasks and responsibilities, must have often read it, so should we!


