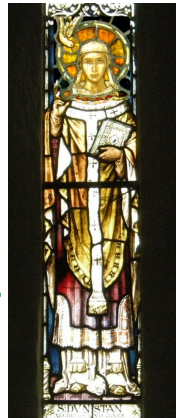

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY: Today we remember all those who gave their lives for others. We

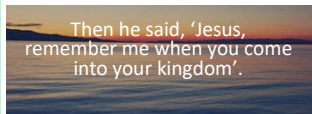
remember those who give their love for us. Help us to be willing givers. Amen.

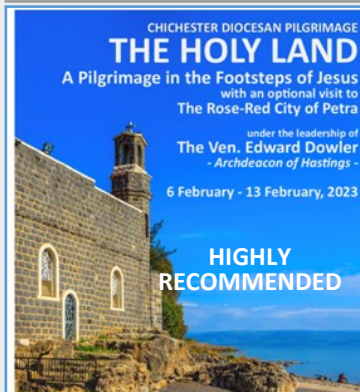
