In this country an early Harvest Festival used to be celebrated at the beginning of the harvest season, on August 1st. It was called **Lammas**, meaning **'Loaf Mass'**. Farmers made loaves of bread from the fresh wheat crop and these were given to the local church as the

communion bread during a special Service of Thanksgiving. Our modern tradition of celebrating, thanks to the **Revd. Robert Hawker**, is usually held on the nearest Sunday to the 'Harvest Moon,' i.e. the full moon that occurs closest to the autumn equinox on 22nd or 23rd September. Di

St Dunstan's Baby and Toddler Group is back! Twice a month from 9.00am in London House.


